
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

Rules and Regulations

1. NO EXHIBIT WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR JUDGING UNLESS LISTED IN THE PREMIUM LIST.

2. All entries must have been made or grown by the exhibitor since August 12, 2024. This is the day after our last held Fair.

3. To exhibit in 4-H Division, you must be enrolled as a Maryland 4-H member no later than June 1, 2024. Anyone registered in Worcester, Wicomico or Somerset counties is eligible.

4. For the purpose of age categories within 4-H Divisions, a Junior will be any youth aged 8 as of January 1, 2025, through age 10; Intermediates are those age 11 as of January 1, 2025 through age 13; and Seniors will be age 14 as of January 1, 2025 and older. Open division entries will be judged in two age groups: Open Youth - ages 8-18; Open Adult - 19 and over. All youth age 7and under as of January 1, 2025, will exhibit as a "Youngster". Youngsters are not permitted to compete and will receive participation awards for their efforts.

5. RULES GOVERNING EACH DEPARTMENT WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. Questions concerning interpretation of rules will be brought before the Worcester County Fair Board for a ruling.

6. Only one exhibit by an exhibitor may be entered in each class, except livestock.

7. All exhibits will be judged on competitive basis (1st, 2nd, 3rd, place) in each class. **4-H is no longer judged on the Danish system**.

8. Premium Awards, provided by the Maryland State Fair Board and Worcester County, will be based on ribbon placing received.

9. There will be a Grand Champion award of a ROSETTE and \$10.00 premium for the outstanding 4-H exhibit in each division. 4-H Reserve Champion will receive a ROSETTE. Open exhibits in each division will only receive a rosette.

10. ALL JUDGES' DECISIONS WILL BE FINAL.

11. Exhibits (excluding rabbits, poultry, and livestock) will be received at the Fair in JWS Park from 3:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 6th (entries will only be accepted during these times). Exhibits may only be removed after the conclusion of the awards ceremony on Sunday, August 10th. ENTRIES MUST BE PICKED UP BY 5:00 P.M. OR YOU WILL FORFEIT ALL PREMIUM MONIES.

All livestock exhibits will be accepted at the Fair in JWS Park from 3:00 – 8:00 p.m. Thursday, August 7th.
 Registration forms for all exhibits are due by July 22nd 2025.

ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED BY JULY 22ND, except for 4-H competitions.

14. Classes appearing in the Worcester Fair Catalog may not be eligible for State Fair entry. See State Fair Premium Book for classes.

TYPES OF COOKIES

There are five basic types of cookies. All have much the same basic ingredients, but the proportions used, the method of mixing, and the additions result in different finished products.

Drop: Soft dough is simply dropped from a spoon onto a cookie sheet.

Bar: Stiff dough is spread or pressed evenly in flat pan, baked, cooled, and cut into bars or squares.

Refrigerator: Stiff, rich dough is shaped into rolls, wrapped, chilled well in refrigerator so that it can be cut into thin slices. Pressed: Dough is forced through a cookie press or pastry tube into various shapes. Molded: Stiff dough is rolled between hands into balls, logs, crescents, etc.

- 2. All photos must be at least 5" x 7" in size and not larger than 8" x 10", except sequence/story classes, which should be a minimum 4" x 6" and a maximum of 5" x 7" in size. (Example: buildings, flowers, people)
- 3. All photos must be mounted on a firm board using spray adhesive,

heat seal or other permanent mounting medium. Use a pre-cut mat if needed. Foam Core is not acceptable. Do not frame the photos and do not use clips of any kind. Photos may be mounted horizontally or vertically. Mat size should correspond to photo size, for example: Photo: $5'' \times 7'' = Mat$: 8" x 10"; Photo: 8" x 10" = Mat: 11" x 14".

Notes: Bird house plans must state the species of bird for whom the house is designed. Refinished item plans must include a "before paragraph and a statement of intended use for the item. Exhibitors may also include photographs that show various stages of the refinishing process.

 5'. Where indicated in class description, LD is "largest dimension" and SD is "smallest dimension".



- All entries from kits are considered to be crafts and should be entered in that department if there are appropriate classes. A kit is defined as an exhibit assembled or made from precut pieces whether it is a commercial-ly purchased kit or the pieces are precut for a workshop and then assembled by the Exhibitor. All exhibits in the other wood classes must be made to yave a classes must be yave a classes a c
- 4. Special note regarding bird houses: Bird houses with perches attract unwanted, non-native birds such as House Sparrows and European Starlings that are more aggressive than our native birds such as the Bluebird. Currently, these non-native birds are primarily responsible for the decline of many of our native cavity-nesting species. Only the decorative bird house class may have entries with perches.
- Judging criteria: design and plan, workmanship, choice of wood, suitability and quality of finish, usefulness.
- 6. A wiring diagram and statement of intended use must accompany each exhibit. Enclose all documentation in an envelope printed with the Exhibitor's name, age, phone #, 4-H County/ City and class. Attach envelope to exhibit with string or tape.
- Used exhibits must be in a clean/ presentable condition. Exhibits not meeting safety requirements (i.e. improperly wired) may be disqualified.



Herdsman Award Criteria

All exhibitors of livestock, goats, and larger animals are eligible to be considered for this award. Experience in 4-H, FFA or age will not be a factor. The Herdsman Award selection committee will be determined by the Livestock Superintendent, and Fair Board President; prior to start of the Fair. Exhibitors and leaders will not be aware of the members of the selection committee. Observation will occur randomly, throughout the Fair, starting with the time of livestock entry. The purpose of this award is to recognize a youth who consistently demonstrates excellence in the following areas.

These are not necessarily listed in order of importance:

- 1. Personal behavior consistent with the values stated in the 4-H motto.
- 2. Compliance with livestock rules and regulations.
- 3. Knowledge of livestock being exhibited.
- 4. Care of livestock being exhibited.
- 5. Cooperation in maintenance of barn area.
- 6. Rapport with and courtesy toward public in the livestock exhibit area.
- 7. Attentiveness to and respect for livestock superintendents, parents, and leaders
- 8. NEW THIS YEAR: To be considered for Herdsman, exhibitors must create an educational

poster to be displayed in the barn. This poster may exhibit livestock health, breeds, or a description of their livestock project.

Exhibitors may not under ANY CIRCUMSTANCE feed or water another exhibitor's animal. They also may not enter the pen of another exhibitor under ANY circumstance. This will automatically disqualify them from the award

2025 Livestock Rules and Regulations

 All entries must be pre-registered by August 1, 2025. Only forms sent by mail, email, or online portal will be accepted.
 All livestock entries must meet the requirements of the State of Maryland Animal Health Department and be accompanied by approved Health Papers at the time of registration. All animals must be tagged according to the prevailing USDA requirements.

3. All animals must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. All 4-H exhibitors must be registered by June 1, 2025, with the 4-H Educator or FFA Advisor in their County. All 4-H exhibit animals shall be registered in accordance with the "Maryland 4-H Animal Ownership Deadlines." All animals shall be tagged with proper USDA tags. Additionally, all Market Class animals shall be tagged with the proper 4H tags or FFA tags. See our website for additional information. Dairy and Beef entries will be limited to 4 animals per exhibitor.

4. Open classes are for anyone not enrolled in 4-H or FFA in Worcester, Wicomico, or Somerset Counties. Anyone 8 to 108 may compete in open and show "off trailer" unless you have written permission from the livestock superintendent. Those enrolled in FFA/4-H in Worcester, Wicomico, or Somerset MUST enter 4-H or FFA classes.

5. Registration will be from 5:00 – 8:00 p.m. Thursday, August 8. All animals must be checked in and secured in pens with proper bedding, feed, and water by 10:00 p.m. The Livestock Areas shall be in order when the Fair Opens on Friday, August 9. Livestock may not be removed until 5:30 p.m. Sunday, August 11th. PENS ARE RE-SERVED FOR FFA and 4-H only. Open classes are "show off trailer" only. Those enrolled FFA or 4-H must use the pens for the duration of the weekend.

6. Exhibitors are responsible for the care of their animals. Pens, stalls and animals shall always be always kept presentable. The exhibitor is responsible for providing all needed equipment to care for the animals and to keep the Barn in order. The aisles should be kept clear to allow the public to move through the exhibit without risk. No washing will be allowed outside of designated areas.

7. All animals must be exhibited by their owner/exhibitor, except in classes where

2 animals must be shown in the same class. In this case, the other animal must be shown by a properly attired youth or 4-H/FFA member.

8. Proper Fitting and Showing attire is required for all classes and shall be according to the guidelines in the Maryland State Fair Book. No opened toed shoes. 4-H and FFA members must wear a neck piece. A scarf, bolo tie, tie, or ribbon will be accepted.

9. All Market Classes will be broken down based on weight at weigh-in at the Fair at the discretion of the Livestock Superintendent. Animals entered in Market Classes may not be entered in Breeding classes.
10. Ages of all animals for entry into classes shall be the age of that animal on June 1 of the current year unless otherwise stated.

11. If there is only one entry in the class, the placing and award of that entry shall depend upon the entry's merit, which will be made at the discretion of the Worcester County Recreation and Parks staff and County Fair Live Committee.

12. All exhibitors, parents, and persons working with the exhibits, or the exhibitors are expected to demonstrate courtesy and respect toward the livestock, other exhibitors, any persons working in the livestock area and the public. Anyone displaying inappropriate behavior may be disgualified and asked to leave the Fair. No drugs, alcoholic beverages, or disrespectful language will be tolerated. 13. All exhibitors are expected to fit their animals. Assistance from other 4-Hers is permitted for Juniors and first year exhibitors, but the exhibitors are expected to do the work themselves. Senior exhibitors are not permitted to receive assistance in fitting animals. Immediate Family members and other FFA/4-H youth may also help in the fitting of the animal. Exhibitors may also have help

moving the animal to the arena. 14. Overnight stay at the Fair shall be limited to those youth with Goats, Rabbits, Poultry, Sheep, Swine, Beef, and/or Dairy Exhibits. Exhibitors wishing to stay at the Fair overnight must be accompanied by a parent or approved adult supervisor (written permission must be given to the Livestock Superintendent). All youth staying overnight will not be permitted to leave the Fair after Fair Hours. 15. All exhibitors will be expected to clean up their pens on Sunday, August 11th. **16.** Every effort will be made to protect the entries while at the Fair. However, the Worcester County 4-H / FFA Fair disclaims any responsibility for loss or damage to property or persons.

17. All rules are subject to final interpretation by the Livestock Superintendent. Any rule interpretation or change made by the Livestock Superintendent shall reflect the best interests of the Worcester County 4-H / FFA Fair and the youth involved.

State of Maryland regulations require that all poultry entered in exhibition must originate from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean flock as defined in title 9 of the Code of Federal Regulations or every participating bird must have a negative test for Salmonella Pullorum-Typhoid within 90 days before the fair. These tested birds must be separate from the remainder of the flock. If birds are comingled, then all tests are void. Documentation of test results shall be on MDA-E20, VS form 9-2, VS form 9-3, or comparable form. For Out of State poultry health requirements, you may call the Maryland Department of Agriculture at 410-841-5810 or web site

- 3. The Maryland Dept. of Agriculture regulations require that all poultry entered into exhibition be tested for the avian influenza virus within 30 days of entry or originating from a NPIP avian influenza clean or monitored flock.
- All poultry must be registered in the Maryland Domestic Poultry and Exotic Bird Premises Registration Program. All poultry shall be identified with a Maryland Dept. of Agriculture approved tamper proof numbered leg or wing band.

RABBITS

- All entries must be pre-registered by July 22, 2024. The Rabbit Show will be open to 4-H / FFA Youth, Open Youth, and Open Adult. You must bring to the fair a completed selfcertification of animal health for each entry.
- 2. Entries must be in place between 5-8 p.m. Thursday, August 8. Animals will be released on Sunday, August 11 at 3:00 p.m.
- 3. Exhibitors are responsible for providing food and water for their animals.
- Class, breed, rabbits age division, and ear tattoo number must be written on the entry form. Must be in accordance with the Maryland Dept. of Agriculture rules.
- Rabbits in breed classes must be a minimum of 12 weeks old to be shown. NO EXCEPTIONS. There are no fur classes.
- 6. Rabbits will be judged by the latest ARBA Standard of Perfection.
- A breed champion will be selected from those breeds with 5 or more entries.
- Rosettes will be awarded to Breed Champion and Reserve Breed Champion.
- 9. Any rabbit showing signs of disease will be refused entry.
- All exhibitors are responsible for presentation of animals for judging unless prior arrangements have been made with the Rabbit Superintendent.

<u>DOGS</u>

Rules and Regulations All dogs shall be immunized and have a valid rabies vaccination. A copy of the Rabies certificate must be submitted with the entry and be on hand at the time of the show to be checked by show chairman. Dogs without valid rabies vaccination will be ineligible to show. All grooming should be done by the exhibitor. No artificial preparation such as powder or corn starch may be left on the dog. Any exhibitor seen doing otherwise will automatically lose points in their class and may forfeit their premiums. Handler's attire for 4-H dog show: Boys: Slacks, shirt, and tie (no jeans). Girls: Skirt or slacks, and blouse or shirt (no jeans). Females in season are not permitted to compete. If females are in season, another project dog may replace her in the same class ONLY. Any

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dog holding C.D. from the American Kennel Club cannot compete in sub-novice classes or novice classes. Mixed breed dog or unregistered dog may be entered in the competition. The Judge may excuse from the ring any dog or handler who falls in these categories:

A: Any handler who willfully interferes with another participant or their dog.

B: Any dog which cannot be controlled by its handler.

C: Any obviously ill or lame dog.

D: Any handler who abuses his dog in the ring. Dogs will be allowed on the grounds, show day only, until the close of the fair. They must remain in their kennels and must be attended to. There will be a designated area for the kennels.

Premiums will be awarded to register projects to Worcester County 4-H and FFA only.


